What is a network?

A network is ...

- ... a system of links
- ... a group or system for the inter-linkage and interaction of its members

Value of networks in icm

- Recognition of integrated coastal management
 - Multiple uses
 - Many stakeholders
 - Risk and uncertainty
 - Rapid change

Value of networks in icm

- Recognition of **integrated** coastal management
 - Multiple uses
 - Multiplicity of stakeholders
 - Risk and uncertainty
 - Rapid change
- If there is no one/body who knows everything, we need to:
 - Communicate
 - Cooperate
 - Coordinate
 - Collaborate

Value of networks in icm

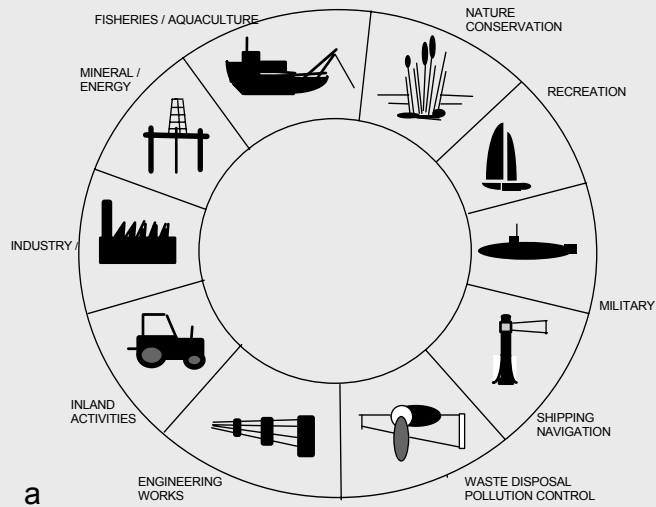
- Links different types of people/organisations
- Provides rapid communication channel
- Allows sharing of information
- Can change ways of thinking
- Can generate unexpected outcomes
- Has potential to lever change
- Gives confidence to develop actions

Different functions for networks

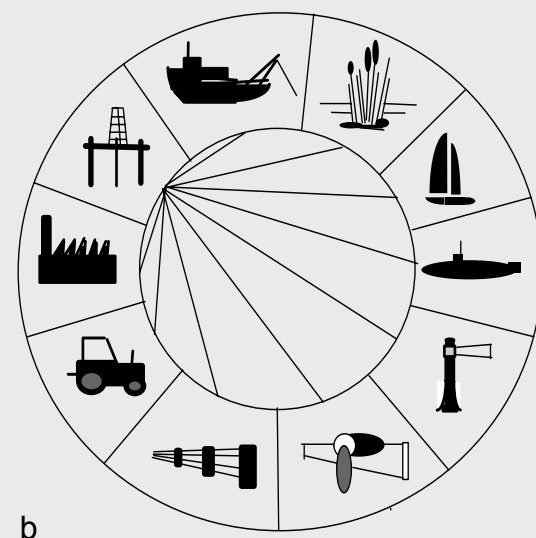
- Policy networks

Coastal networks

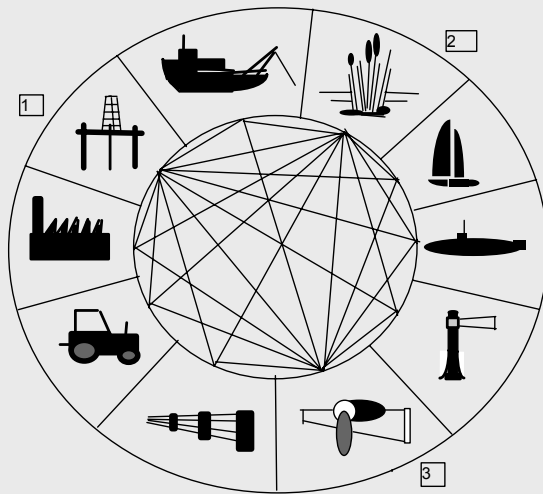
- Bringing everyone at the same level together – horizontal networking



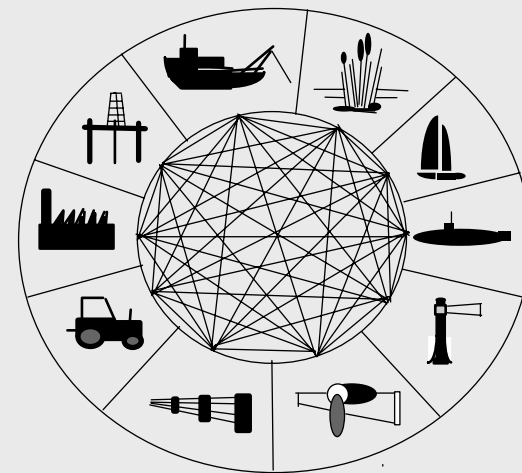

a: major use sectors in the coastal zone.

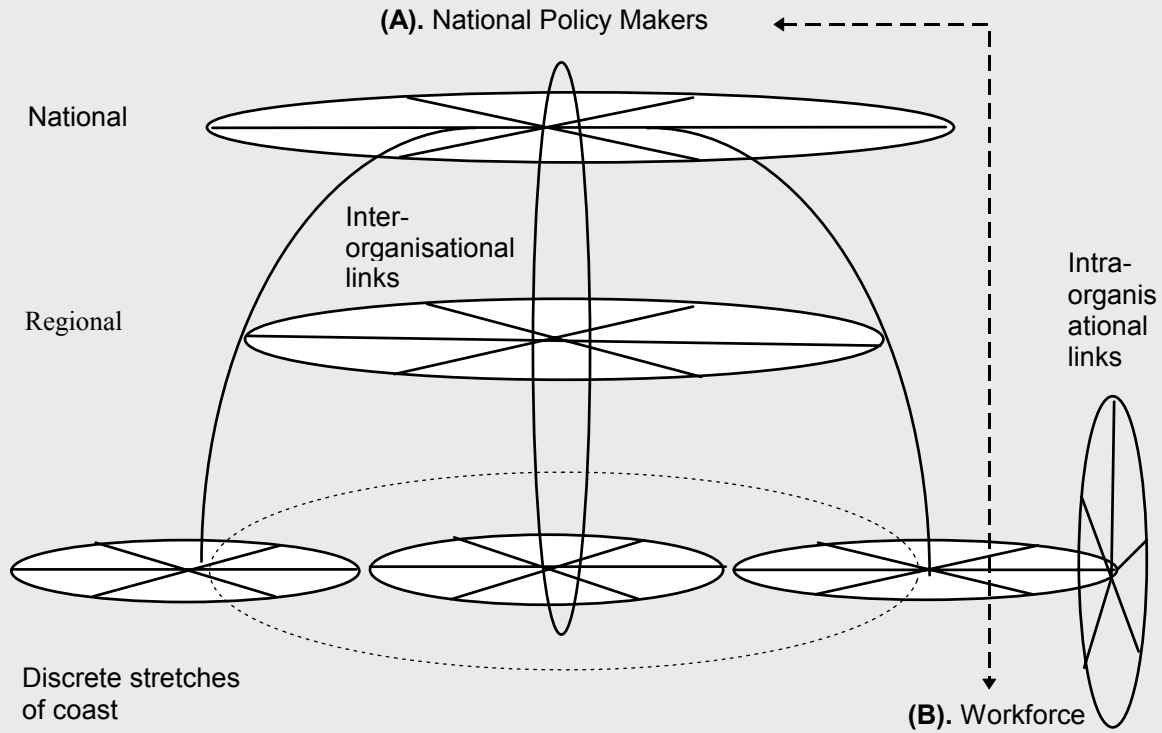
b: the establishment of one or more horizontal communication links for one sector.

Organising the network

- Open or closed
- Fixed or fluid
- Narrow or broad
- Formal or informal
- Local, regional, national or international
- With services or just membership contact
- The centre or 'linking pin': with volunteers or officers

Requires establishing the purpose

- Mutual problem solving
- Seek consensus
- Identify emerging trends
- Mobilise resources
- Obtain resources
- Develop outside relationships
